Cattery Sanitation Checklist



A clean environment is a healthy environment. This checklist outlines the essential daily, weekly, and monthly cleaning protocols required to maintain a sanitary cattery and break the chain of infection. This involves three steps: cleaning (removing debris), sanitizing (reducing bacteria), and disinfecting (eliminating pathogens).

DAILY	
	Scoop all litter boxes at least twice daily (more frequently for a queen with a litter)
	Wash all food and water bowls with hot, soapy water
	Check and top off water fountains with fresh, filtered
	Wipe down feeding areas
	Spot-clean any messes on floors or other surfaces with a pet-safe cleaner
WEEKLY	
	Completely empty, scrub, and disinfect all litter boxes before refilling with fresh litter
	Wash all cat bedding, blankets, and soft toys in hot water
	Mop all hard floors with a pet-safe disinfecting solution
	Fully disassemble and deep-clean water fountains to prevent biofilm buildup
	Thoroughly vacuum the entire cattery space, including cat trees and furniture
	Check and clean/replace air purifier filters.
MONTHLY	
	Thoroughly wipe down and disinfect all surfaces, including walls, baseboards, and window sills
	Wipe down and disinfect all cat trees, scratching posts, and hard toys with a veterinarian-approved disinfectant (like Rescue/Accel)
	Disinfect all hard toys, food storage bins, and grooming tools.
ONGOING -	
BIOSECURITY PROTOCOLS	Use completely separate cleaning supplies, litter boxes, scoops, and food/water bowls for the quarantine and isolation areas Always handle cats and clean in this order: healthy population
	first, then quarantine, and lastly, isolation. Always wash hands thoroughly and change clothes/shoes (or use disposable booties) between handling cats in different areas to prevent cross-contamination.
